BACKGROUND:





Careers

- 1. Career Education Courses: CLC and CLE courses have been helpful in exploring career options.
- **2. Teacher Support:** Teachers encourage and introduce students to various careers, such as corporate law and teaching.
- **3. ADST Classes:** Classes focused on making things, like mechanical engineering, are inspiring.
- **4. Trades Programs:** High school offers trades programs like hairdressing and other trades, providing life skills.
- 5. Parent Career Talks: Parents sharing their career experiences helps students learn about different options.
- **6. Exposure to Careers:** Opportunities to explore careers through internships, business, science, etc.
- 7. Internship Programs: Internships allow students to explore and understand their interests.
- **8. Diverse Electives:** Electives like psychology, law, makerspace, woodworking, and photo help students discover their passions.
- **9. Mentorship Programs:** Mentorship programs and capstones provide valuable guidance.
- **10. MYBLUEPRINT:** The MYBLUEPRINT tool is highly praised for career planning.
- **11. Post-Secondary Nights:** Events at the beginning of the school year provide information on post-secondary options.
- 12. Career Advisors: Career advisors at schools like Mouat and Abby are beneficial.
- **13. Counsellor Relationships:** Good relationships with counsellors and teachers help students explore career options.
